H1N1 vaccine is available for
the following groups:

- Adults, ages 25 - 64 yrs. with medical conditions
- Children, ages, 6 mos. - 24 yrs. regardless of medical condition
- Children, ages 6 mos. - 9 yrs. needing a second dose
- Pregnant Women
- Parents, Care Givers & Household Contacts of infants less than 6 mos. of age
- Healthcare Workers

The H1N1 vaccine is currently available in both the nasal spray and injection (shot).

Nasal spray is recommended for healthy individuals, ages 2-49 years. The injection is recommended for those under age 2, those with medical conditions regardless of age, and those older than age 64.

The H1N1 vaccine is FREE.
There is no charge to receive it.

Children, ages 6 months to 9 years receiving the H1N1 vaccine either in shot or nasal spray form need two doses of the vaccine.

The second dose should be given 28 or more days after the first dose. The first dose "primes" the immune system; the second dose provides immune protection. Children who only get one dose of vaccine when they need two doses may have reduced or no protection.

Beginning Dec. 14,
H1N1 vaccine will be available
to all Knox County residents,
regardless of their age
or health condition.

Therefore, the second-dose clinics planned for the week of Dec. 14 will be open to EVERYONE, including adults of all ages and medical conditions, school staff, college students, children needing a second dose and children needing the first dose.
