GUIDELINES FOR FREDERICKTOWN EDUCATION ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIP

1. The full amount of the FEA Memorial to each recipient is not to exceed \$4000. This will be distributed yearly for 4 years at \$1000 per year for 4 consecutive years unless special circumstances arise which would require approval by the Executive Committee.
2. Each student applying for the award will complete an application form supplied to him/her which was adopted by the FEA Educational Award Committee in 1980.
3. Student will submit a 250 word essay establishing his/her goals and need.
4. Each student will submit three recommendations [only ONE by a teacher or school official, other two by community members or coaches who know the student well] to the Award Committee.
5. Student must have a 2.5 or better GPA in high school.
6. Student must major in college in the field of education—either elementary or secondary. Once a student changes majors, the scholarship funds are no longer awarded.

7. Student must maintain a 2.5 or better in college. **The student** will send a copy of his/her college transcript to the FEA Scholarship Chairman at the end of EACH of the FIRST THREE COLLEGE YEARS.
8. The recipient of the award will receive the current annual award per year. That means, a student enrolled in a four-year program will receive a check for \$1000 for each year (a total of \$4000). It is the student's responsibility to yearly notify the Scholarship Chairman of his/her program.
9. **Checks will be payable to the COLLEGE or UNIVERSITY but sent to the student.**
10. A committee appointed by the FEA for the selection of student recipients will be made each year. The Scholarship Chairman will be elected by the general membership and serve on the Executive Committee.
11. A teacher is not to serve on the FEA Scholarship Committee if his/her own child is eligible for an award. This would include blood relatives, adopted and foster children. A child of a staff member is eligible for this award provided he/she is selected through due process the same as other students.
12. A student may attend any accredited college of his choice – in or out of the state of Ohio.
13. All information, forms, etc. must be submitted to the Scholarship Committee by a specified date so that the committee may make its selection and the awards made at the Senior Awards night. **Transcripts for previous recipients are to be submitted to the FEA Scholarship Chairman by September 30 for renewal.**
14. **A recipient forfeits his/her remaining award if at any time he/she withdraws from college or the field of education.**

Please have forwarded to the Scholarship Chairman **three (3)** letters from individuals who can attest to your attributes, abilities and desires to become a teacher. These individuals should know you well enough to describe why they believe you will become an effective teacher. **Only one** letter of recommendation (plus the checklist on the last page) should be submitted from a high school teacher, administrator, counselor, or staff person. **Two** of the three individuals could be members of your church, employers, or anyone who has had a personal contact with you. If you are working as a helper in the classroom of a teacher at a younger grade level or babysitting for that teacher, this person would be considered an employer, **not** a teacher.
