

Guidance Events and Information 2019-20

Fredericktown High School

September 23 – Knox County College Night at Kenyon College at the Kenyon Athletic Center (KAC) from 6:30-8:00 p.m. Come visit more than 50 colleges at once – it's a one stop shop to learn about many college options!

September 25 – ASVAB – 7:45 am at the Old High School
The ASVAB is a multiple-aptitude battery that measures developed abilities and helps predict future academic and occupational success in the military. It also provides general information to students about what careers might be of interest. This test is free. Please register in the guidance office.

October TBD – KCCC Visit to FHS to meet with 10th graders about 11th grade programs and potentially attending the KCCC.

October 16 – PSAT for Students in Grades 10 and 11 at the Old High School
Cost: \$17. Fee waivers are available for those who qualify. Register in the Guidance Office by September 16. 11th graders who take this test may qualify for the NMSQT with distinctions and scholarship money!

October 10 – 9th Grade Team 9 Visit to MVNU
All 9th Graders will visit MVNU to experience college life for a day! They will eat lunch in the dining hall (students must submit \$5 unless on free/reduced lunch program), visit classrooms, administration buildings, and dorm rooms and learn about college life.

October 26 – ACT
Register and pay online at actstudent.org.
Test will be given at Fredericktown High School. See flyer for more information.

October/November – Attention seniors, fill out the FASFA for college!
Seniors and parents should file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FASFA). Previous year personal tax information is needed to complete this form. The form can be filled out online at <https://fafsa.ed.gov/>.

October 22 – College Credit Plus (CCP) Meeting, 5-6 pm
This meeting is encouraged for any student wanting to take college courses for the next school year. Meeting will take place in the Fredericktown High School commons. Intent forms are required by April 1.

October 24 – Financial Aid Night, 5-6 pm
Questions about filling out and submitting the FASFA will be answered by a college financial aid representative. Meeting will take place in the Fredericktown High School library.

November TBD – 10th Grade Visit to the KCCC. Learn about KCCC labs and more about 11th grade attendance. You must sign up to attend.

December 2-20 – Ohio’s State Tests/End of Course Exams/AIR Assessments. All 11th graders will take the Government test during this timeframe. This testing window is also for students who need to retake Algebra 1, Geometry, Biology, Government, English 9 and English 10 tests. These tests count towards your 18 points for graduation! Specific dates and information to follow.

January 16 – Scheduling Night, 5-8 pm

Bring parents and come visit with your teachers to talk about what courses you plan to take next year. Scheduling forms will be handed out and a class meeting will take place before this event. Students will register for course selections in the computer lab starting the week of January 28. More details to follow.

January TBD – KCCC class presentations to 9th, 11th and 12th graders. Representatives will discuss 10th and 12th grade labs and potential admittance as well as adult education programs for graduating seniors.

February 25 – All 11th graders take the state mandated ACT. No registration is required for this state required test.

March 23-May 8 – Ohio’s State Tests/End of Course Exams/AIR Assessments for students taking Algebra 1, Geometry, Biology, Government, English 9 and English 10. These tests count towards your 18 points for graduation! Specific dates and information to follow.

April 4 – ACT

May 4 – AP U.S. Government Placement Test

Advanced placement test for students taking this course for college credit. This test is required for students taking this course and will be added to your school fees. Register in the guidance office. Fee waivers are available for those who qualify; see the guidance office for details.
